

#### UNBELIEVABLE FACTS













- © Birds often fly long distances over oceans without any rest breaks. This has prompted scientists to try and understand how they sleep during such long flights. Turns out, many birds can shut down one hemisphere of their brain at a time and fly with the other, allowing them to travel long distances.
- ⑤ Joseph Strauss, the chief engineer for the construction of the Golden Gate Bridge, was one of the first to require workers to wear hard hats during a project. He also spent \$130,000 on an innovative safety net that was placed under the bridge during its construction. This went on to save the lives of 19 construction workers on the project.
