THE OCCASIONAL COLLECTIVE~ TREYNOR



The old barber shop was purchased by new owner, Alysia Hess in 2021 giving new life to the building in Treynor, new purpose and a new name: The Occasional Collective. Born and raised in Omaha, Hess became an Iowa transplant when she gave up city life and moved to a farm in Macedonia in 2017. The UNL graduate is a happily dedicated, 26-year veteran employee and Supervisor of the Interactive Animal Programs at Omaha's Henry Doorly Zoo and Aquarium.

When asked what inspired her to create the Occasional Collective, Hess had a 2-prong approach. The shop was created to enhance our Southwest Iowa community by providing a venue that would increase exposure for home-based small businesses. Secondly, it also highlights our local producers and puts their goods closer to the consumer. Hess stated, "The COVID crisis has shown us that our supply chains can break down quickly, but that local producers and makers can still thrive if given the opportunity". She believes that connections with our neighbors will strengthen the bonds that rural areas need to survive. Supporting local and supporting friends and family will only further fuel local commerce. While Hess did have some obstacles along the way, she said that it was all worth it in the end. Her most rewarding part is when she gets to meet the makers, learn their stories and engage with the community. Whether it be an acquaintance, or a story - the connections she is making help create a space of comfort that she is hoping people will keep coming back to.

Hess is very proud of the fact that 85% of the product in the shop is locally sourced from producers in both Nebraska and Iowa. She has a deep connection with nature which also inspires her advocacy for conservation and sustainability in products she chooses. Being a small business owner in Treynor, Alysia said that it means so much to her to be able to contribute and add value to the community. It is her hope that the longer she is around, the more she can give back. Hess has many future plans but because her space is limited, she will have to be creative. When asked if she had any advice for others starting their own business, Hess stated, "Do your research and use the AMAZING resources that Southwest Iowa has for entrepreneurs including WIDA, Advance Southwest Iowa and the Small Business Development Center at IWCC. Shaved ice is a sweet staple there so the Smiths decided to bring their love of the island back to the Midwest. They had a few challenges trying to find a food trailer and getting the plumbing finished but ended up flying through the inspections with ease. Along with traveling, the Smith's are big outdoorsmen who enjoy spending time outdoors hunting and fishing. The trailer boasts 21 base flavors including favorites cotton candy, pina colada, cherry, grape, pineapple, bahama mamma, lemon lime, strawberry, mai tai, banana, coconut, vanilla, green apple, daiquiri, peach and tiger's blood plus many more inspired combinations. POTT. COUNTYWIDE TOURISM PROMOTION COMMITTEE



The Pottawattamie Countywide Tourism Promotion Committee is a collaborative group working to entice visitors to make the county a destination. Formed back in 2006, committee members include representation from Golden Hills RC&D, the Council Bluffs Convention & Visitors Bureau, Macedonia, Pottawattamie Conservation, Western Iowa Development Association (WIDA), and the Pottawattamie County Board of Supervisors. The PCTP Committee meets on a bi-monthly basis, with Pottawattamie Auditor Melvyn Houser serving as the committee chair.

According to Tourism Economics, direct spending by travelers totaled \$219.89 million in Pottawattamie County in 2020. Dedicated to continued economic prosperity, the committee acts as an advocate for the local tourism industry, provides promotion, marketing, and ongoing support of local events and attractions through multiple avenues. The group produces the WattaWay county map, WattaWayIA.com tourism website,West Nishnabotna River brochure, Trail Capital of Iowa rack card, and Stars & Bronze Tribute Trail brochure (highlighting the Eagles of Honor project in the county).

From Marine life to greener pastures, Tiffany and Quentin Carritt are living their dream in the rolling Loess Hills. On a recent visit, they gave me a tour of their 17-acre property where weeks of their lives. Our broilers are pastured I asked about their transition from the military to poultry farming. Quentin explained that veteran candidates take a series of personality tests upon out processing which aids in determining their possible career path. When his kept coming back with farming as a possibility it was not a complete surprise. Growing up in Onawa, Iowa his grandfather had been a row crop farmer but that was not something that really interested him. After happening upon a 3-hour podcast featuring Joel Salatin, a livestock farmer from Swoope, Virginia whom he refers to as "The Godfather of Pastured Poultry", he was intrigued. The couple researched Salatin's regenerative food and farming systems, and their vision came to fruition. Finding good land was the next step.

By the time the couple moved from California to Iowa they had a plan. Paradigm Pastures originated in 2019 when the couple found the perfect acreage in Crescent. The name paradigm meaning "a model", in this case a model or style of farming long reinvented from America's oldest farmers. Their vision: To produce real food grown the way that nature intended, with a model of ethical and humane animal stewardship, that limits the impact on the environment and regenerates the land. Their Cornish Crosses, also known as broilers, are the same breed typically processed in confinement houses for meat. Chickens are birds, and birds are not meant to live in the dark indoors. This kind of life is not healthy or comfortable for chickens, which is why the practice is considered unethical for some.

The Carritt's process is quite different Quentin stated to me, "Since the broilers are only alive for eight weeks, we want it to be the best eight with fresh air, sunshine and fresh pasture daily where they can forage for new grubs". Rotating the broilers daily also allows their land to build up nutrients naturally. Broilers are processed in June right on the property through a kosher and humane style of processing. In summer months, they also raise one batch of turkeys and process them just in time for Thanksgiving. Their Pastured turkeys can be pre-ordered and range anywhere from 16-26 pounds.

At Paradigm, the Carritt's have a passion for conserving traditional breeds, which is why they are especially fond of their Buckeye's (egg-laying chickens). Interestingly enough, these are the only breed founded by a woman whom hails from Ohio. These ladies also enjoy a pastured lifestyle, foraging on the lush pastures of the Loess Hills where they can produce anywhere from 18-24 eggs daily.

On the farm, the couple works the land responsibly, holding themselves accountable for ethical and environmental standards, in which they are completely transparent and welcome the opportunity to show others what mice away. With 25 years of marriage under they are doing. Their market is for people who their belt and a lifetime to go, they have found want to come out and see how and where their animals were raised. It is an experience in itself to be able to come out and pull eggs for oneself, which children really enjoy.

Since starting the acreage, Tiffany has also discovered the love of keeping bees. After working as a Stem Program Coordinator for the Girl Scouts of Hawaii and seeing the passion that one of the girls demonstrated towards her bee project, Tiffany started researching them herself. With 1.5 years of research under her belt before arriving at the farm, she got them up and running pretty quickly. She started with one hive, rescued a few, lost a few over the winter months and then got a few more. Her plans are to keep expanding hives and eventually join the Loess she has increased her harvest from 20 to 60 jars in the past two years. The pollination process is reaping even more benefits for her garden and it is good for the clover on their property. With her three queens, Beeyonce, Beezus and Bad Babee, and thousands of workers, that nectar should keep flowing.

As the evening went on, we sat down and talked about future plans for Paradigm Pastures while a sweet little hummingbird settled in. The couple are firm believers that everyone should be buying local and are working on meeting some of those demands. Tiffany and Quentin are excited that they have built an amazing lifestyle in Crescent with their two kids, Daltin and Kelsey, their dog Moose and a handful of felines to keep the their "paradise". They want to share their passion with people around them. It is their hope that people enjoy the bounty just as much as they enjoy bringing it to your tables. One of their favorite times of the year is November when they open their doors and celebrate with an Annual Marine Corps Birthday Dinner; a magical night where they share stories, have a reading of the messages, and cake cutting ceremony with fellow Marine Corps family.

Expansion plans are in the works, as they talk about the possibility of raising cattle and pigs in the future. Quentin also hints at potential of starting an internship program. Tiffany does an amazing job of documenting their efforts in a monthly newsletter, with everything from Hills Beekeeping Association. In the meantime, shopping locally, raising chickens, growing her garden and preserving the harvest so that they can eat like our great grandparents did.
