Launched in 2022 by The Occasional Collective owner, Alysia Hess, Food Truck Fridays have become a treat for Treynor and our surrounding communities. Food Trucks bring a new a new air of excitement with the variety of food they bring to the streets, the community formed around them, convenience, creativity, fun for the whole family and affordability. Yes, that's right. While many menu items being served up around the country carry hefty price tags in a fancy restaurant, food trucks still manage to be highly affordable on average topping out around \$10 to \$20 for a meal.

Hess believes that connections with our neighbors will strengthen the bonds that rural areas need to survive, and that supporting local entrepreneurs will only further fuel local commerce. Along with Food Truck Fridays, Hess has collaborated with and featured products from nearly 100 independent entrepreneurs and producers since opening the doors last year. With a background in conservation, the shop is a testament to what Hess holds most dear: sustainability, inclusivity and community, with 85% of the products in store coming from lowa and Nebraska. Her goal of supporting and elevating other small businesses knows no bounds, and she encourages those looking for more exposure to reach out to collaborate with a pop-up event at the store. Bluml grew up on a farm near Macedonia, Iowa and has loved looking at, studying, and creating art for as long as she can remember. As a child, she learned about basic art principles and techniques from Joan Scott, a talented area artist. Joan also introduced her to a variety of artists and creative styles that inspired and mesmerized her.

Barbie studied Art at Dana College before changing her major to social work. She graduated with a BSW in 1994 and has been working with children and families throughout her career. 

What Are State Requirements?

Ribbon Cutting Ceremony Information

Congratulations! If you are reading this, you must be getting ready to celebrate the opening of a new business, an anniversary, or the relocation/expansion of an existing business in western lowa. We are excited for your success and appreciate the opportunity to help you mark this momentous occasion. A ribbon cutting can inaugurate a business's first day or it can take place after your soft opening. We provide these services absolutely free to businesses in our area.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF HOLDING A RIBBON CUTTING?

Because the ribbon cutting marks a significant moment in the business's history, this is a great photo opportunity to record. The ribbon cutting ceremony gives the owner a chance to introduce themselves to those gathered and the community at large to talk about what their business does. Word-of-mouth can travel farther than you might think. Owners have also used this time to publicly thank their financial backers, employees, family and friends, and/or business partners. WIDA will gladly coordinate with your city officials, invite our Board of Directors and business members to attend, promote your event on our website, Facebook page and newsletter (if submitted ahead). Our staff will arrive at your location with ribbon and official ceremonial scissors, as well as take photos and share them with you, on our social media and in the next newsletter. WIDA has a large reach within western lowa, and we want others to hear about your business.

THINGS TO CONSIDER ABOUT YOUR RIBBON CUTTING

WHO will cut the ribbon? The owners or top executives most frequently do the honors, but each organization is different and can pick whomever they like. WHEN will you hold your event? We find that Wednesday-Fridays, midday over the lunch hour, late afternoon, or early evenings draw the largest crowds. Getting the word out 3-4 weeks in advance is highly recommended for maximum exposure and attendance. WHAT you wish to share prior to cutting the ribbon. You can thank those who helped along the process, how you came about starting your journey, or share any specials or upcoming events. Please limit your speech to 3 minutes or one page of notes. HOW to maximize the event. Consider telling all of your family and friends and sending invites to clients. Offer drawings/raffles to collect business cards to build your database. Typical events only last 15-30 minutes. Drinks, refreshments, decorations and door prizes are optional and up to you. Keep in mind, however, that the actual ribbon cutting ceremony is typically short and sweet. Your grand opening celebration with others can keep going as long as you wish.


